Any 4-H member, 3rd grade through one year post high school.



Other information:

- A 4-H member may sell a maximum of one large animal and one small animal at the sale.
- The species that are sold at the sale are beef, sheep, swine, goat, chickens, turkeys, ducks, and rabbits.
- This will be the 42nd Annual Market Animal Sale.



- 4-H members need the support and encouragement of their family. Parents and other family members can contribute in many ways to the 4-H program. They may help members:
 - Determine project goals
 - Obtain necessary project supplies
 - Carry out work at home
 - Maintain records
 - Evaluate project work
 - Attend club meetings
 - Participate in countywide events
 - Choose to become a 4-H volunteer

Cloverbud—4-H member in grades K-2nd grade

Club Meeting—monthly meeting for 4-H members



What Are Project Meetings?

A project meeting is defined as a scheduled meeting which is planned, organized, coordinated, and/or taught by a certified 4-H volunteer with the purpose of learning new project skills or mastering project knowledge which will assist the 4-H member enrolled in 4-H project work.

Routine tasks associated with project work should not be considered as an appropriate substitute for project meeting attendance. For example, feeding a pet cat daily should not be considered a project meeting. As the purpose of the 4-H program is one of education and not competition, project meetings should provide an opportunity to develop new skills. Therefore, project meeting focus should be on skill development and not simply on fair exhibit completion and



competition. For example, if a 4-H member baked purple ribbon cookies at a project meeting last year and returned to bake the same recipe this year, this activity would be defined as project work and not a project meeting as no new skills were developed.

4-H Terminology continued....

Club Leader—an adult volunteer who is responsible for the general operation and coordination of the club.

Project Leader—work with individual members, or a group of youth, in a project area to support and guide their learning.

Adult Leaders —group of countywide volunteers who set policies, coordinates countywide activities, and plan and promote the county 4-H program.

**Reminder—if you are actively volunteering and are not approved you are not covered under 4-H Insurance!

Volunteer Process

- VIP (Volunteers in Preparation) In person or Zoom, 1.5 hours, Beginning of Volunteering, No refresher needed
- <u>Supporting You, Supporting Youth Training</u> Online, approximately 10 minutes- refresher needed every year
- <u>Building Safe Spaces Training</u> Online, approximately
 45 minutes- refresher needed every 2 years
- Mandated Reporter Training
 Online, approximately 45 minutes, no refresher needed
- <u>Background Check</u> Beginning of Volunteering, Completed every 4 years

Scholarship Requirements

- All applicants must possess a sincere interest in the pork industry. 1.
- All applicants must pursue a post high school education, i.e. college, vocational school, short course, etc. 2.
- All applicants are required to fill out and return the form, found at the above link, no later than **DECEMBER 1, 2023**

Each year, the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation provides a sum of money to the State 4-H Office for needs-based scholarships for youth to participate in



statewide Educational Experiences. Wisconsin 4-H believes that cost should not be a barrier to program participation. This funding is separate from any county scholarship that they may apply for, and any youth who is participating in a Statewide Educational Experience may apply.

What do I have to do?

Youth must complete a *Portfolio* and return it to the Extension office by **JANUARY 15, 2024.** The portfolio process includes submitting a cover letter and resume, a letter of recommendation, discussion question response and participate in an interview. For more information on what is needed to complete a Portfolio, go to our website price.extension.wisc.edu and search for PORTFOLIO.

For those who turn in a portfolio, interviews are scheduled for February 5 before the Adult Leader meeting.




