Volunteer Process

- VIP (Volunteers in Preparation) In person or Zoom, 1.5 hours, Beginning of Volunteering, No refresher needed
- <u>Supporting You, Supporting Youth Training</u> Online, approximately 10 minutes- refresher needed every year
- <u>Building Safe Spaces Training</u> Online, approximately
 45 minutes- refresher needed every 2 years
- Mandated Reporter Training
 Online, approximately 45 minutes, no refresher needed
- <u>Background Check</u> Beginning of Volunteering, Completed every 4 years



Local 4-H Happenings

ABOUT SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The Wisconsin 4-H Foundation will award more than \$20,000 in scholarships to outstanding Wisconsin 4-H members and alumni pursuing higher education in 2024.

ELIGIBILITY Criteria

- 4-H member for at least three years
- Should have a grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4.0 scale
- Be enrolled or planning to enroll at the a university, college or technical school during the 2024-2025 academic school year.
- Previous years Scholarship winners are not eligible to receive a second 4-H Foundation scholarship

APPLICATION PROCESS

Application must be received by the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation via email by Friday, March 1, 2024, 5:00pm

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Each year, the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation provides a sum of money to the State 4-H Office for needs-based scholarships for youth to participate in



statewide Educational Experiences. Wisconsin 4-H believes that cost should not be a barrier to program participation. This funding is separate from any county scholarship that they may apply for, and any youth who is participating in a Statewide Educational Experience may apply.

Interested in traveling? Check out the website above to see what 4-H Educational Experiences are offered. If you are interested, there are ways to help with the cost. In addition to



applying for a scholarship through the Wisconsin 4-H Foundation (above), you can receive a scholarship from the Price County 4-H Adult Leaders to cover up to half the cost of a trip.

What do I have to do to apply for a scholarship?

Youth must complete a *Portfolio* and return it to the Extension office by **JANUARY 15, 2024.** The portfolio process includes submitting a cover letter and resume, a letter of recommendation, discussion question response and participate in an interview. For more information on what is needed to complete a Portfolio, go to our website price.extension.wisc.edu and search for PORTFOLIO.

For those who turn in a portfolio, interviews are scheduled for February 5 before the Adult Leader meeting.

*Be sure to register in 4-H Online as soon as possible after registration opens for any Educational Travel Experience you want to attend. Spots fill up fast. You can always choose later to not attend.

MAKING THE BEST BETTER CLUB MEETINGS

We all want to have fun 4-H meetings. And we still need to take care of business - that can be fun too. 4-H was established as a way to educate our youth and their families, so we don't want to forget the educational part of our meetings. The skills youth learn from presenting a project talk, illustrated talk or demonstration at club meetings can help them throughout their lifetime. Hopefully, each of our clubs are offering every youth an opportunity at least once each year to present a short program during the club meeting. Youth may choose when they present and what they want to present.

Looking for ideas for a demonstration? Something that you have learned in your 4-H project or that you really enjoy doing will make a good 4-H demonstration. Choose a topic that others will also find interesting like "How to Tie-Dye a T-Shirt," "How to make a Fruit Smoothie," "How to Care for Houseplants," or "What to Feed a Pet."

Illustrated talks are great because you have prompts on the posters. Ideas might include: "How to Build a Bird Feeder (or whatever else you want to make)", "How to Make Maple Syrup", "How to Show a Pig" and "Good Photos - What's the Secret?" They can even be about any topic you find interesting - "My Favorite Vacation", "Various Ways to Cook Potatoes", "Why Snowshoeing is the Perfect Winter Sport", or "Things to Know When Visiting Disney World".















Project talks can inform the group about anything you have learned in one of your 4-H projects. "Choosing Fishing Lures", "What to Wear When Competing in a Horse Show", "Shooting Sports Safety" or "Tips for Cake Decorating"

A simple script printed out on index cards to help remind youth what they want to say (not just read it) instills confidence and helps youth do a good job presenting. Every good 4-H presentation begins with an interesting line to catch people's attention. Then "Hi, my name is . . . and I'm a member of the . . . 4-H Club. Today I want to talk to you about . . ." The body of your presentation. Then a conclusion that encourages the audience to learn more about the topic.

There are many opportunities in 4-H for youth to learn throughout the year. And club meetings offer multiple ways. Guest speakers from the community (many of the parents have things to share about their jobs or hobbies) can be nice occasionally. An educational tour of a local business or resource (like a library) can be interesting for a change of meeting location. And of course, youth presenting a program.
