The WI 4-H Horse Association has updated their handbook for the year. Go to our website (price.extension.wisc.edu) and search horse.

New starting in 2024 for State 4-H Horse Shows: Youth are permitted to share a horse. Each exhibitor may show any combination of classes provided the horse is only shown once in a specific class number (horse may not show against itself). Horse Educational: Did you know that there are a number of horse educational activities that don't require the member to show/have a horse - just a spark for horses? There is a horse speaking and demonstration contest, hippology (skill-a-thon), horse quiz bowl, judging, team problem solving, model horse, and areas for the arts such as photography, posters, drawing and painting, and more. 

GAME "TASTES LIKE...": Healthy Lifestyle



MATERIALS NEEDED:

- Blindfold
- Samples of healthy foods such as grapes, carrots, banana slices, apples slices, cheese, whole grain bread, celery, nuts, and pretzels
- CAUTION: beware of allergens and make substitutions as needed.



APPLICATION:

Ask

- Encourage that healthy food snacks and fun and good to eat.
- What are some other healthy food snacks?
- What are some snacks you would want from the grocery store?



BOOKS TO READ:

My Food, Your Food, Our Food, by Emma Carlson Berne The Berenstain Bears and Too Much Junk Food, by Stan and Jan Berenstain



WHAT TO DO:

- Place food samples on a tray so everyone can see them.
- Blindfold first participant and give them a sample taste.
- Ask what the food is and then which food group it belongs (vegetable, fruit, grain, protein, or diary)
- 4. Let everyone have a turn.



the captain and leader of our club you will keep us on task, leading with ideas and activities that will help us learn and grow!


Vice President- Collin 'Apple Jacks' Jack of all trades, filling in for each officer in their absence. You will help members wherever needed.


