


The Price County Fair is August 22nd - 25th.



We are excited that you are planning to exhibit in this year's Fair!! As you complete your entries, PLEASE note the following:

Enter all family exhibitors. Each member must have their own subaccount in your family account. Then enter each family members' entries. Do NOT process payment until ALL entries have been added for ALL family members.

Process your invoice for payment in the system. If you process prior to having everyone's entries in, you will have to wait for your invoice to be approved before you can add more exhibitors or entries to a new invoice.

Premises ID is a required entry if entering animals in the Fair. Also note, If you are entering horses, please have your Coggins scanned on your computer as it must be uploaded with your horse entries. When the VET gives you the Health Certificate for your Swine, it will also need to be uploaded. The Poultry Pullorum Testing document will also need to be uploaded when completed. All of these documents are required for the specific species. If they are not uploaded prior to the Fair, your animals are not allowed on the fairgrounds.

Fair Reminders

DHS Issues Summer Fair Season Health Reminders



Simple precautions around animals can reduce the spread of illness
The 2024 fair season in Wisconsin begins this week and with it comes an opportunity for Wisconsinites of all ages to visit animals up close. The Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) is reminding Wisconsinites that animals can carry diseases that may make people sick, but simple steps can help ensure a safe and enjoyable time.

If you go to fairs or petting zoos this summer, DHS recommends:

- Washing your hands with soap and warm water for at least 20 seconds or using an alcohol-based hand sanitizer after touching animals or leaving areas with animals.
- Staying away from animals including cattle, pigs, or other domesticated animals that appear sick, as well as barns or areas where sick animals are.
- Preventing the spread of diseases into your home by taking off and washing clothes or shoes that were
 worn around animals when you get home.
- · Staying home if you are sick.

This year's fair season takes place as DHS and DATCP continue to monitor cases of HPAI (H5N1) in dairy herds, wild birds, and domestic poultry flocks. The recent infections in dairy herds have led to three human HPAI (H5N1) cases in dairy workers who were in direct contact with infected animals. At this time, Wisconsin has no confirmed cases of HPAI (H5N1) in dairy cattle, poultry, or humans. DHS and DATCP continue to support Wisconsin's agricultural industry in taking action to test animals, protect

workers, and keep the public informed.

General Requirements for Show Organizers

Fairs or exhibitions lasting more than 24 hours must appoint a licensed veterinarian to inspect all livestock daily and review the below records.

Fairs or exhibitions of any length must obtain, review and keep for five years all required records and test results including:

Exhibitor's name and address
Animal identification (number, type, description)
Documents showing compliance with disease testing and other health requirements
Livestock premises number, if any, where animals originated
If requested by the fair or show organizer, documentation showing legal importation
(if applicable) and movement to the event

Animals infected with or exposed to contagious or infectious diseases may not be commingled (or housed/kept) with other animals at a fair, show, or other exhibition in such a way as to allow disease to spread. Such animals should not attend the fair, show, or exhibition. Animals may be denied entry if they arrive at these events with contagious or infectious diseases, isolated and/or removed if they develop disease after arriving, or be subject to other action as would be necessary to control disease.





Guidelines for Housing and Managing Animals

The state veterinarian recommends that show organizers do the following:

House cattle separately from llamas, vicuñas, alpacas, guanacos, and other exotic ruminants

House cattle separately from small ruminants, especially sheep
House swine separately from any other mammals
Include a space for the premises registration code on livestock entry forms
Provide hand-washing stations near all livestock facilities
Provide individual watering and feeding troughs rather than common ones
The state veterinarian recommends that exhibitors do the following:

Vaccinate breeding cattle against bovine viral diarrhea (BVD) at least 30 days before the event

Test cattle for BVD-PI by immunoperoxidase test, and bring them to shows only if they test negative

Test cattle for Johne's disease test results by ELISA test, and bring them to shows only if they test negative

Clean and disinfect vehicles used to transport animals to and from the show, and vehicles used at the show, before and after the show

Isolate exhibited animals returning to their farms or animals purchased at the show for 21 days before mingling them with other stock




MEET OUR 4-H SUMMER INTERN!
